Welcome to Cooper Lake State Park, NTOA's newest and largest mapped area. This year's event will be Do It Yourself format to comply with State of Texas and OUSA guidelines. It's provided as a free service by NTOA to promote orienteering and Cooper Park.

All participants must pay Cooper Park entry fee when arriving. You should register on the website at www.ntoa.com, download and print the map, prior to going to the park. If you are going on weekend, you might pre-register with Cooper Park to insure entry. They have limits on how many can enter, although I don't expect big crowds in winter.

When you arrive at the park, proceed to the Buggy Whip equestrian area. Follow signs to parking on the east side of the Buggy Whip loop. Look for start signs near the equestrian trailhead on the west side of loop. Have fun, but use care around any horses. Participants are not required to wear masks when on course, but respect spacing if others are encountered. No water is provided on the course.

Please use courtesy around campsite areas and when walking along roads. Everyone should plan check-in person, to alert, if you don't return on time.
